
The Problem


Romans 5:20-21 – Moreover the law entered that the offense might abound. But where sin abounded, grace abounded much more, so that as sin reigned in death, even so grace might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Conclusion

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- > The Conclusion Reached

 - Romans 6:12-13 Therefore behave appropriately!
 - Romans 6:14 We Are Not Under Law (under it's Stirring Up of Sin Effect presented in Romans 5:20-21)

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- > The Problem Defined
 - Romans 5:20-21 Moreover *the law entered that the offense might abound*. But where *sin abounded*, grace abounded much more, so that as sin reigned in death, even so grace might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.
 - ➤ We are dealing with one function of the Torah, its ability to stir up sin within an individual (The Stirring Up of Sin Effect)

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- > The Solution Developed
 - ➤ Romans 6:1-2 What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?
 - We have literally died to sin!
 - **The proof?**
 - Your life has been forever changed hasn't it?
 - > You're not the same person you used to be.

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- > The Solution Developed
 - > Romans 6:3-4 Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.
 - 1. We died to sin and this death to sin is seen in our baptism
 - 2. But our death has a purpose so that we can be resurrected to walk in newness of life

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- > The Solution Developed
 - ➤ Romans 6:5-6 For if we have been *united* together *in* the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection, knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin.
 - The reason we died to sin (the old man being crucified) is so that we would no longer be servants of sin.

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- > The Solution Developed
 - ➤ Romans 6:7-11 For he who has died has been freed from sin. Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more. Death no longer has dominion over Him. For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God. Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
 - > Death frees a person from sin and we only need to look to Messiah as an example of this understanding.

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> The Conclusion Reached

- > Romans 6:12-14
 - Therefore *do not let sin reign in your mortal body*, that you should obey it in its lusts. And do not present your members *as* instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members *as* instruments of righteousness to God. For *sin shall not have dominion over you*, for *you are not under law* but under grace.
 - 1. Do not let sin reign in your mortal body = do not give in to sin!
 - 2. We Are Not Under Law (under it's Stirring Up of Sin Effect presented in Romans 5:20-21)

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Our True Freedom From the Law (Torah)

> Paul's Logical Progression

- Paul has shown that Adonai's solution for the Stirring Up of Sin Effect has two-parts that are connected in a cause and effect relationship.
- > *The Cause* The solution revolves around changing your nature by removing sin from within you (sinful nature, unregenerate heart, the old man, uncircumcised heart, being born again, etc.)
 - All these Biblical metaphors describe act of Adonai changing the human heart so that it is no longer bent on sinning/rebelling against Him

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- > Paul's Logical Progression
 - > The Solution (Cause) By removing sin from within us
 - ➤ How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?
 - For he who has died has been freed from sin.
 - > The Solution (Effect) We have been freed from the Torah's Stirring Up of Sin effect
 - For sin shall not have dominion over you, for *you are not under law* but under grace.
 - > It doesn't get any more logical than this.

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Our True Freedom From the Law (Torah)

- > Paul's Logical Progression
 - ➤ Paul spent Romans 6:1-11 describing the CAUSE part of the solution to the Stirring Up of Sin effect.
 - ▶ He introduces the EFFECT part of the solution to the Stirring Up of Sin Effect in ¹ Romans 6:12-13 (present your bodies to God) and ² Romans 6:14 (you are not under law) but under grace)
 - ➤ But as we shall see, Romans 6:12-13 and Romans 6:14 are two "short" answers, which Paul will follow up with further explanation in Romans 6:15-23 and Romans 7:1-6!

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- > Romans 6:12-13 Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts. 13 And *do not present your members* as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but *present yourselves* to God as being alive from the dead, *and* [present] your members as instruments of righteousness to God.
 - Romans 6:15-23 is Paul's explanation how to present our bodies to Adonai

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- > Romans 6:14 For sin shall not have dominion over you, for *you are not under law* but under grace.
 - > Paul's explanation of what it means to not be under law
 - > Romans 7:1-6 Or do you not know . . . 4 Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ . . . 6 But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by,

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- > Paul's Logical Progression
 - > Romans 5:20-21 Define Problem (Stirring Up of Sin Effect)
 - > Romans 6:1-11 Define and Develop/Explain the Cause Part of the Solution (We *died to sin* through Messiah)
 - > Romans 6:12-14 Final Conclusions of the Cause Part of the Solution and Introduction of the Effect Part of the Solution (*yield ourselves to God & you are not under law*)
 - > Romans 6:15-23 How to yield ourselves to God
 - > Romans 7:1-6 What it means to not be under law

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Our True Freedom From the Law (Torah)

- > The Problem Defined
 - > Romans 5:20-21 Moreover *the law entered that the offense might abound*. But where *sin abounded*, grace abounded much more, so that as sin reigned in death, even so grace might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.
 - ➤ We are dealing with one function of the Torah, its ability to stir up sin within an individual (The Stirring Up of Sin Effect)

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- > First Part of the Solution Identified
 - > Romans 6:12-13 (the short answer)
 - > Therefore *do not let sin reign* in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts. **13** And *do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness* to sin, but *present yourselves to God* as being alive from the dead, and your members *as* instruments of righteousness to God.
 - Let's see how this is further explained (the longer explanation of Romans 6:12-13) in Romans 6:15-23

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15 What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? Certainly not! 16 Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin *leading* to death, or of obedience *leading* to righteousness? 17 But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered. 18 And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness. 19 I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness.

20 For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. **21** What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things *is* death. **22** But now *having been set free from sin*, and having *become slaves of God*, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life. **23** For the wages of sin *is* death, but the gift of God *is* eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

 - > Romans 6:14 (the short answer)
 - Romans 6:14– For Your Are Not Under Law
- > The Solution Explained
 - > Romans 7:1-3
 - Romans 7:1-2a Law in effect during life
 - Romans 7:2b-3 Freed from Law through death
- > The Conclusion Reached
 - > Romans 7:4-6
 - Romans 7:4-5 Dead andDelivered from the Law

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- > The Solution Identified
 - > Romans 6:14
 - For sin shall not have dominion over you, for you are not under law but under grace.
 - 1. Do not let sin reign in your mortal body = do not give in to the Stirring Up of Sin effect!
 - 2. We Are Not Under Law (under it's Stirring Up of Sin Effect presented in Romans 5:20-21)

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- > The Solution Developed/Explained
 - > Romans 7:1-2a
 - > Or do you not know, brethren (for I speak to those who know the law), that *the law has dominion over a man as long as he lives*? For the woman who has a husband is *bound by the law to her husband as long as he lives*.
 - 1. The Torah is effective when someone is ALIVE
 - 2. The woman is bound (under) by the Torah as long as the husband LIVES

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- > The Solution Developed/Explained
 - > Romans 7:2b-3
 - But if the husband dies, she is released from the law of her husband. So then if, while her husband lives, she marries another man, she will be called an adulteress; but if her husband dies, she is free from that law, so that she is no adulteress, though she has married another man.
 - 1. DEATH frees a person from the law of marriage
 - 2. The woman is freed from the law of marriage when the husband DIES

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> The Conclusion Reached

- > Romans 7:4-6
 - Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another—to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God. For when we were in the flesh, the sinful passions which were aroused by the law were at work in our members to bear fruit to death. But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by, so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter.

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- > The Conclusion Reached
 - > Romans 7:4-6
 - 1. We have become dead to the Torah
 - 2. We have been delivered from the Torah
 - > Why? Where is the death????
 - Romans 6:1-3 What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it? Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?

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> The Conclusion Reached

- > Romans 7:4-6
 - Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another—to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God. For when we were in the flesh, the sinful passions which were aroused by the law were at work in our members to bear fruit to death. But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by, so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter.
 - We're dead to and delivered from THIS ASPECT of the Torah!

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Our True Freedom From the Law (Torah)

> The Conclusion Reached

- > Romans 7:4-6
 - Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another—to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God. For when we were in the flesh, the sinful passions which were aroused by the law were at work in our members to bear fruit to death. But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by, so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter.
 - What did we die to? The Torah or Sin?

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- > The Beauty of Paul's Example of Marriage
 - ➤ Romans 7:1-2a Law in effect during life
 - > Romans 5:20-21 The Stirring Up of Sin Effect was "in effect" when we (the old man) were alive (in sin)
 - ➤ Romans 7:2b-3 **Freed from Law through death**
 - > Romans 6:1-3 There's been a death . . . Our death in Messiah. The old man responsive to sin is dead
 - ➤ Romans 7:4-5 **Dead and Delivered from the Law**
 - ➤ Romans 6:14 We are no longer "under law". We have been "delivered from" and are "dead to" the Law, i.e., "the Stirring Up of Sin effect of the Torah"!

 - > Romans 7:7-12 No, the Law is good but stirs up sin in the unredeemed

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- > Although the Law is Good, is it THE Cause of Death?
 - Romans 7:13-25 No, but the Torah stirs up sin so that it becomes even more sinful

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
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

Romans 7:7a What shall we say then? Is the law sin? Romans 7:7b Certainly not! Romans 7:7c On the contrary, I would not have known sin except through the law.

For I would not have known covetousness unless the law had said, "You shall not covet." **8** But sin, taking opportunity by the commandment, produced in me all *manner of evil* desire. For apart from the law sin was dead. **9** I was alive once without the law, but when the commandment came, sin revived and I died. **10** And the commandment, which was to bring life, I found to bring death. **11** For sin, taking occasion by the commandment, deceived me, and by it killed me. **12** Therefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy and just and good.

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14 For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. 15 For what I am doing, I do not understand. 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Our True Freedom From the Law (Torah)

> Prerequisites to Understanding Paul

- > Paul is referencing a unique set of circumstances
 - > The Israelite nation
 - A nation where everyone knows Torah (it's the law of the land)
 - > Before regeneration, in their fallen, sinful state
- People who are not saved but "love" the Torah!
 - > Galatians 1:13-14, Romans 10:1-4, Luke 11:37-54 (the Pharisees and lawyers),

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- > Arguments For Romans 7:14-25 Speaking of Paul Struggling With Sin as A Believer
 - ➤ His usage of "I"
 - The person in Romans 7:14-25 is a believer because he loves Gods' law!

 - ➤ From the portions of Romans 5:20 7:13 that <u>clearly</u> reference the Stirring Up of Sin Effect (not Romans 7:14-25)
 - ➤ Sin Was Stirred Up Romans 5:20 (sin abounded), Romans 7:8 (produced in me all manner of evil desire), Romans 7:9 (when the commandment came sin revived), Romans 8:2 (free from the law of sin and death), Romans 7:11 (sin, taking occasion by the commandment, deceived me), Romans 7:13 (so that sin through the commandment might become exceedingly sinful),

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- > What Characterizes People Who Are in the Stirring Up of Sin State?
 - ➤ From the portions of Romans 5:20 7:13 that <u>clearly</u> reference the consequences of the Stirring Up of Sin Effect
 - ➤ Alive to/Slave to Sin Romans 6:2 (died to sin), 6:6 (no longer be slaves to sin), 6:11a (dead indeed to sin), 6:7 (freed from sin), 6:12 (don't let sin reign), 6:14 (sin shall not have dominion over you), 6:16 (one's *slaves* whom you obey, whether *of sin leading* to death), 6:17a (you were slaves of sin), 6:18 (having been set free from sin), 6:20 (you were slaves of sin), 6:22a (having been set free from sin)

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- > What Characterizes People Who Are in the Stirring Up of Sin State?
 - ➤ From the portions of Romans 5:20 7:13 that <u>clearly</u> reference the consequences of the Stirring Up of Sin Effect
 - > **Dead** Romans 6:13a (alive from the dead)
 - ➤ In the Flesh Romans 7:5 (in the flesh), Romans 7:6a (we were in the flesh), Romans 8:1 (do not walk according to the flesh), Romans 8:4 (do not walk according to the flesh), Romans 8:6-12 for those who live according to the flesh, those who are in the flesh, in the flesh, to live according to the flesh, if you live according to the flesh
 - ➤ Therefore, when Paul states Romans 6:14 (you are not under law), Romans 6:15 (we are not under law), Romans 7:4a (have become dead to the law), he clearly means we are no longer under the Torah's ability to stir up sin within us.

 - ▶ Died to sin Romans 6:2 (died to sin), Romans 6:3 (baptized into His death), Romans 6:4 (buried with Him through baptism into death), Romans 6:6 (united to ether in the likeness of His death), Romans 6:6 (our old man was crucified with Him), Romans 6:8 (we died with Christ), Romans 6:11 (reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin), Romans 6:14 (sin shall not have dominion over you), Romans 6:17 (were slaves to sin), Romans 6:18 (having been set free from sin), Romans 6:22 (having been set free from sin), Romans 8:2 (free from the law of sin and death)

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> What Characterizes People Who Are In Messiah?

- ➤ From the portions of Romans 5:20 7:13 that <u>clearly</u> reference the our freedom from sin **after** Messiah's work

 - ➤ Slaves of righteousness Romans 6:19 (slaves of righteousness), romans 6:22 (having become slaves of God)
 - ➤ **No Condemnation** Romans 8:1 (no condemnation)

- ➤ From the portions of Romans 5:20 7:13 that <u>clearly</u> reference the our freedom from sin <u>after</u> Messiah's work
 - ➤ **Don't walk according to the flesh** Romans 8:1 (don't walk according to the flesh), Romans 8:4 (don't walk according to the flesh)
 - ➤ Walk According to the Spirit Romans 8:1 (walk according to the Spirit), Romans 8:4 (but walk according to the Spirit), Romans 8:5 (who live according to the Spirit), Romans 8:9 (Spirit of God dwells in you)
 - ➤ **Righteous Requirements of the Law Are Fulfilled in Us** Romans 8:4 (righteous requirement of the Law are fulfilled in us)

> When Does the Torah Function to Stir Up Sin?

- ➤ The Old Man State Sin abounded, sin reigned, no longer slaves of sin, you were slaves of sin,
- ➤ The New Man State Died to sin, that the body of sin might be done away with, freed from sin, dead to sin, do not let sin reign, sin shall not have dominion over you, you were slaves to sin, having been set free from sin, having been set free from sin,
